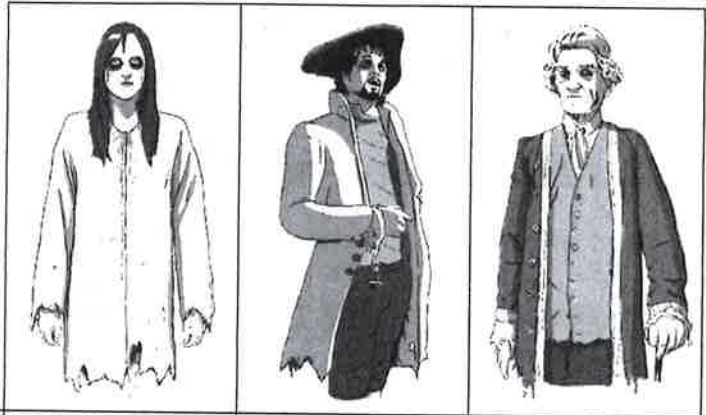
Last summer, my parents booked a holiday in a haunted castle in Scotland. In fact, it's one of the most famous (famous) haunted houses in the country!
