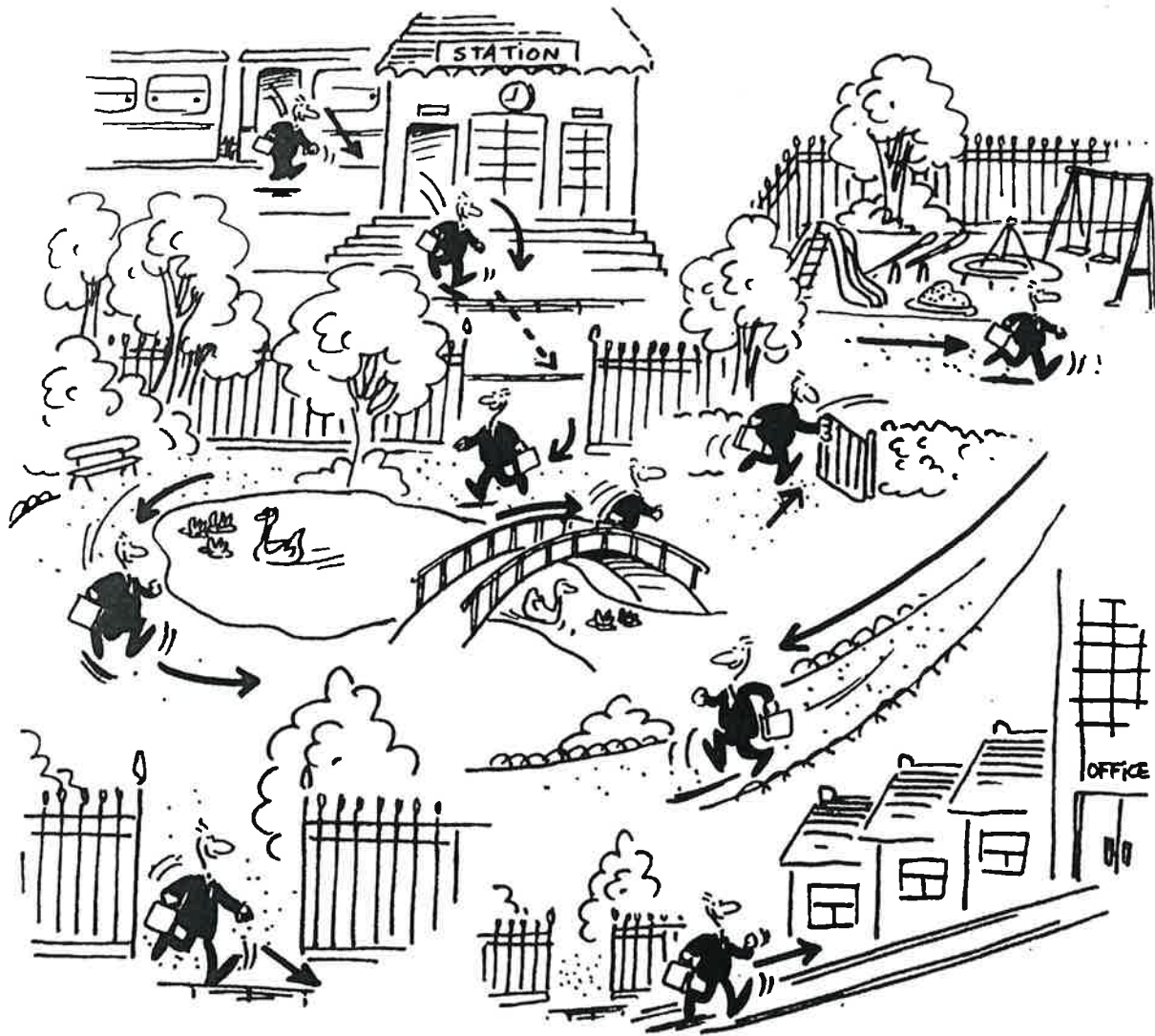


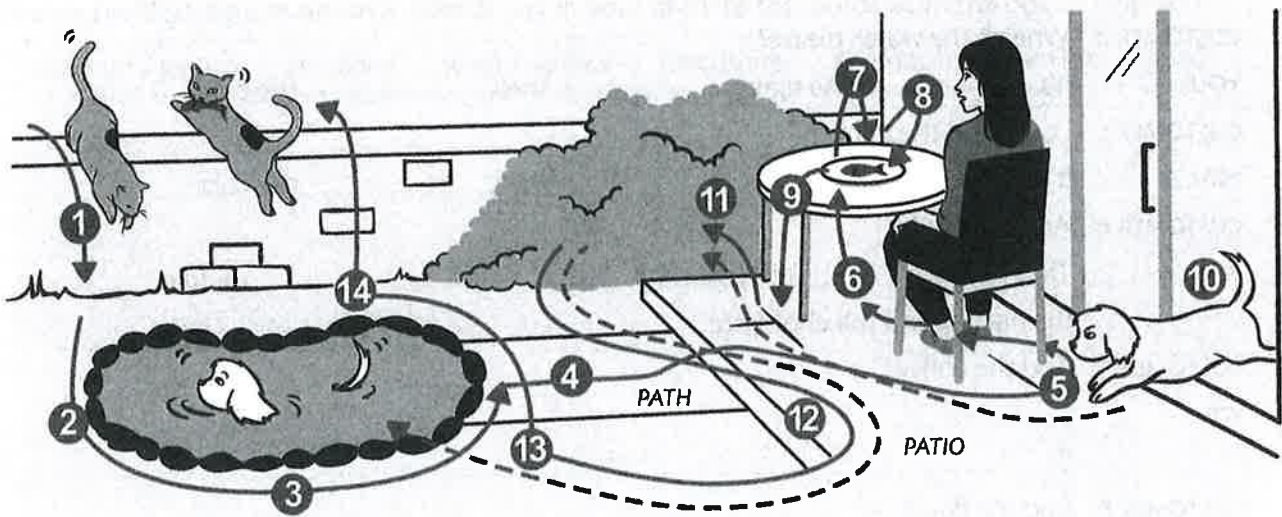
# Prepositions of direction

Look at the picture and complete the text about Peter's way to work with the correct preposition of direction as shown in the example.



Peter goes to work by train. When he arrives in the city he has a little walk from the station to the office. So first Peter jumps ► *off* the train. From the station he has to walk *down* some stairs. Then Peter walks *to/towards* the park. He walks *into* the park and *round* the pond (=Weiher). Then he walks *over* the bridge. After he walks *through* a small gate he walks *past* the playground. Then he walks *along* a pretty path. Finally he walks *out of* the park and *up* a small hill. And then at last he arrives at his office.

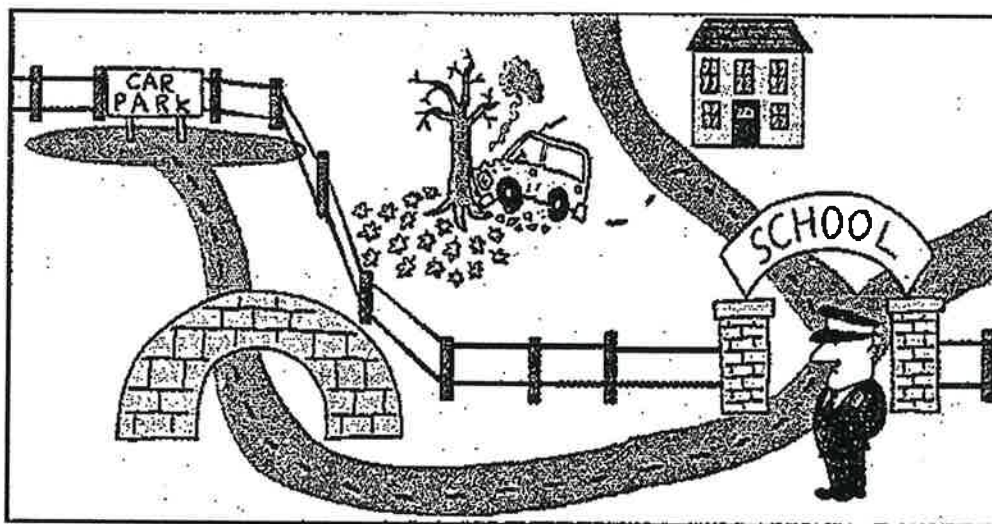


Felix jumped ► (1) over the wall (= Mauer) and walked ► (2) across the grass. Then he went (3) round / past the pond (= Teich) and (4) along the path (= Weg). He walked (5) round Sue's chair and ► (6) under the table. Suddenly, he jumped (7) on/onto the table and took the fish which was ► (8) on Sue's plate. He jumped (9) off the table with the fish. Then the dog, Rosie, came (10) out of the house and chased the cat. They both ran (11) through the bushes and (12) across the patio (= Terrasse). Felix stopped suddenly, but Rosie fell (13) into the pond. Felix looked at her and then jumped (14) over the wall again, still holding the fish in his mouth.
